#### RULES:

1. Each zone gets two identical sets of word strips, one for the zone leader, and a second for the remaining group members.
2. Zone Leader leaves the group. He or she must stay 4 paces away from his or her group.
3. Zones will have 60 seconds to determine a silent signaling method to let their zone leader know in which order to place strips, keeping in mind that the signals they use could be intercepted by other teams.
4. The zone leader's word strips must stay flat on the floor.
5. For the first 60 seconds on timer, the group may begin to sort the slips and signal the zone leader with their scriptures closed.
6. After the first 60 seconds, the group can look in their scriptures, but the zone leader may not.
7. The group whose zone leader correctly orders the timeline strips first wins.
