- 9. Find a man with more than one wife, but not a polygamous marriage.
- 10. Find a woman with more than one husband.
- 11. Find a family with a daughter who died before the age of eight.

- 13. Find a "brick-wall" in your family tree. In other words, find a line that stops because of difficulty in continuing the research due to name change, adoption, immigration, lack of available records, or some other difficulty.
