Cut out the images of "I can be kind to..." (See attached)






You can do the activity as listed in the Sharing time outline by using the attached graphics or you can do a few different variations on the activity.

- 1. Take graphics and tape each one to the back of a bowl. Call children up one at a time. Have them toss a bean bag into one of the bowls. Whichever bowl their bean bag lands in, they get to share an example of a way to be kind to that person.
- 2. Do the same sort of game, except instead of a bean bag toss attach the graphics to large plastic cups that you place upside down on the table. Have them throw the bean bags like a "spilled milk" game.


### Additional Ideas

Family Feud option: Divide the children into two different teams. Bring one child up from each team. Place a metal bowl with two wooden spoons on a small table at the front. Ask one of the attached questions. You can make more questions yourself or more are available for download in our "Kindness begins with me" packet. After you ask the question, the first child to pick up their spoon and hit the bowl wins the speed round. Their team can then name 5 ways to be kind to mom, dad, etc. Repeat process.





