Girl 1A – (speaking in microphone) Girl 3 - Girl 1 – Girl 2 – Theme girls:

Girl 1 is sitting down just quietly thinking when her friends come in one at a time to talk to her. When girl 1 is thinking, someone is speaking in a microphone so that it seems as though we can hear her thoughts.

Girl 1A: (*Thinking*...) Wow! New Beginnings sure was interesting last night. Themes, values, emblems, Personal Progress, what do they all mean? It's all a bit confusing to me. And how could they possibly apply to me anyways? Hmm, this year's theme is D&C 121:45 "Let virtue garnish thy thoughts unceasingly, then shall thy confidence wax strong in the presence of God." (*Continues thinking*...)

Girl 2: Hi Whitney, what are you doing?

Girl 1: Just thinking about New Beginnings and the theme that was introduced for the year- I'm so overwhelmed with it all. I just don't understand how any of it even applies to me. What do you think about it??

Girl 2: Well, to me it says that we should have virtuous thoughts all of the time. Virtue is a quality like chastity, honesty, morality, and faith. You know, things like that...
