

## Sharing Time: September week 3 I should honor my parents

Identify the doctrine: Review the story of Moses if needed. Print and cut out the word strips sheets. (See attached) Tape to the bottom of random chairs around the room. Tell the children that they will be learning about a very important commandment. Have each child look under their chair. See if they can guess who has the first phrase of the scripture. Have them each read theirs aloud. When you find the correct one, have them come to the front of the room. Read it again and tape it to the board. Follow this process until the entire scripture is on the board. Re-read the entire scripture to that point every time you add a phrase.







**Encourage application**: You can either play charades as outlined or build the puzzle that is enclosed. Cut the puzzle up into pieces. Place on the board with the back showing. (So they can't see it.) Call a child up to ask a question. (See attached) If they answer correctly let them pick a puzzle piece and flip it over. The next child does the same thing trying to put together the puzzle. Make sure you talk about each concept before you move on.





