

Sharing time: September Week 4

"I should respect others"

Identify the Doctrine: Start by saying how wonderful primary is because we have so many different children. Every one of them is unique and special. Then depending on the size of your primary you can choose one of the following; Call a child up one at a time and say something that makes that child special. Then, give them the "Every star is Different" card to take home. If you have a larger primary and you don't know individual facts about each child, ask for a few volunteers to say what makes them different and special. Then hand out the star cards.



Teach or sing, if the children already know it, the song, "Every Star Is Different" on page 142 in the Children's Hymn book. If you don't know the song or don't want to take the time to teach it, have a child read it as a poem.

Explain how even though every person is different we should show respect to everyone.

Encourage Understanding: Cut out the numbered stars (see attached) and hide all over the room. Print out and tape together the "I should respect others" sign. Call on one child to find a star. When they find the star read the corresponding case study. (See attached) After you discuss this concept have the child place the star on the board under the "Respect Others" sign. Tell the children that if you find all ten stars and answer the questions, everyone will receive a Starburst candy. (This usually keeps kids a little more tuned into the activity)



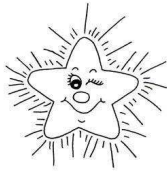
